Introduction from the Kynock Board

Dear Friends and Supporters,

This year, the Kevin C. Kynock Foundation for the Arts continued to honor Kevin Kynock's enduring legacy of arts inspiration by creating memorable opportunities for students to experience the transformative power of the performing arts. With your generous support, we reached more 250 students from schools in Brockton, Cambridge, and Lawrence, Massachusetts by bringing young people to see live performances in Boston for free through our Kynock Immersion Trips and in the classroom through our artist-in-residence programs. These initiatives brought the magic of live performances into students' lives and turned classrooms into vibrant performance spaces led by professional artists.

We're thrilled to announce a new all-digital project being produced in 2025 by our student board member Liam Fitch. Liam is a senior and member of the class of 2025 at Boston College High School where Kevin taught for more than 40 years. This new program will provide students with a unique opportunity to interview professional artists one on one, and recordings of those interviews will be shared online to inspire even more young minds.

Our 3rd Annual Gala was another highlight for the organization raising over \$4,500 for 2025 programs and drawing dozens of Kevin's former colleagues to celebrate his legacy. During the evening, we were deeply honored to present an educator with the inaugural William L. Burke Award to recognize excellence in arts education—a heartfelt tribute to Kevin's dear friend and colleague, William "Bill" Burke, who we lost this year. Bill was a founding supporter of the Kynock Foundation.

Together with your help and support, we are making Kevin's legacy of making the arts accessible for all a reality. Thank you for believing in this mission.

Our programs are designed to help bridge the gap for our education and community partners to access the thriving arts scene in Boston and enrich its audiences.



The Kynock Foundation inspired students from schools in Cambridge, Brockton, and Lawrence, Massachusetts with its two main programs: Kynock Immersion Trips and our Artist-in-Residence visits.

- The Foundation funded four Kynock Immersion Programs to take students to see live performances for free, many for the first time. The performances were:
 - Commonwealth Shakespeare Company's production of "A Midsummer Night's Dream" at the Strand Theater in Dorchester
 - Emerson College's student written play, "Second Star to the Right," at the Greene Theater in Boston
 - The Wheelock Family Theatre's production of "A Wrinkle in Time"
 - The Alvin Ailey Dance Company at the Boch Center's Wang Theater
- The Foundation piloted a new artist-in-residence program featuring a Spoken Word performance in Cambridge and a Salsa Dancing workshop in Lawrence.




In feedback reports from our arts and community partners, the Kynock Foundation programs are ranked highly (5 out 5 stars on average).


The 2024 Annual Kynock Foundation Gala was the most successful event in the organization's history so far. Highlights from the event included:

In the last year, the Kynock Foundation has seen strong growth in both contribution amounts and in the number of contributors. The Kynock Foundation did not have a formal Gala in 2022 due to the coronavirus pandemic.

The Foundaiton hopes to use the 50% growth in contributions from FY2024 to expand its program offerings. In 2024, the Kynock Foundation served more than 250 students in Eastern Massachusetts. The Foundation hopes to at least double that number in 2025.

The Foundation will look to continue to nurture its individual contributor base, but also seek additional funding from potential grant or corporate sponsorship opportunities.
